

Jane Franklin Dance crosses disciplines in partnership with music, media, visual artists and community participants. Named The Best Dance Company in The Washington City Paper "Best of DC 2008," Jane Franklin Dance has earned recognition in the Washington DC metro area by promoting active participation in dance by people of all ages, and with unique collaborations creating work for a variety of locations. Dance education includes performances and workshops for Montgomery County Public Schools and for Arlington's Humanities Project. A STAR Award recipient for "Outstanding Community Outreach," ongoing projects include work with the Senior Adult community, a performing group of dancers ages 40+, and after school projects for youth. Jane Franklin Dance tours for the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts Paul Mellon Arts in Education Program and the Virginia Commission's Tour Directory.

Jane Franklin is a recipient of the prestigious Community Foundation for the National Capital Region Creative Communities Initiative grant for Breaking Ground, a dance and video work inspired by the skate board community.

Jane Franklin Dance made its international debut in 2008 at Foro Performatica a conference/festival at the Universidad Las Americas Puebla Mexico with an interactive sound & video piece, Temporal Interference, which was subsequently performed at the College of Arts and Media at University of Colorado Denver. Dancers manipulate a life size kinetic sculpture in Incidence which was presented by Mead Theatre Lab at Flashpoint, a program of the Cultural Development Corporation.
